"18 But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, which shines brighter and brighter until full day. 19 The way of the wicked is like deep darkness; they do not know over what they stumble. 20 My son, be attentive to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. 21 Let them not escape from your sight; keep them within your heart. 22 For they are life to those who find them, and healing to all their flesh. 23 Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life." Forerunners of the further only approach to life (expressive individualism):

Nero (37-38 A.D.) murdered his wife, brother-in-law, mother, and committed suicide at age 30. Some of his last words were said over and over: "What an artist the world is losing."

Jean-Jacques Rousseau (1712-1778) helped inspire the French Revolution and said, "All I need to do is to look inside myself... my goal is to make known my inner self, exactly as it was in every circumstance of my life." He abandoned his five children to early deaths at an orphanage.

Friedrich Nietzsche (1844-1900) called people to live beyond the "slave morality of biblical Christianity" to embrace a strong-willed master morality that would be seen in the strong man. He spent the last decade of his life in an asylum thinking he was alternately Jesus Christ, Napoleon, or Buddha.

Michael Foucault (1926-1984) saw sexual experience as a path to self-glorification, and advocated legalization of bizarre behavior. He died of HIV/AIDS.

Jean-Paul Sartre (1905-1980) said, "man is nothing else but what he makes of himself." He was known for his broken relationships, and drug and alcohol abuse.

Timothy Leary (1920-1996), was a Harvard professor and advocate of the use of psychedelic drugs for self-illumination.
