Today's Message: Rewards and the Life of Faith

Today's Text: Matthew 10:40-42

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives him who sent me. The one who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and the one who receives a righteous person because he is a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. And whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is a disciple, truly, I say to you, he will by no means lose his reward." Matthew 10:40-42

LEGALIST

I must work to earn the Father's favor; therefore I live a life of unceasing labor with no assurance of His love.

LIBERTINE

Because I am eternally secure in Christ, I will throw caution to the wind and live on the basis of my impulses. (Antinomianism)

We believe that gratitude by faith alone is a powerful motivation for growth and holiness.

We deny that gratitude is the ONLY value for holiness, making all other motivations either illegitimate or legalistic.

"Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. If the work that anyone has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire." 1 Corinthians 3:12-15

"So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil." 2 Corinthians 5:9-10

"He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just." Luke 14:12-14

"...Although Protestants deny the merit of good works, and teach that salvation is entirely gratuitous, that the remission of sins, adoption into the family of God, and the gift of the Holy Spirit are granted to the believer, as well as admission into heaven, solely on the ground of the merits of the Lord Jesus Christ; they nevertheless teach that God does reward his people for their works. Having graciously promised for Christ's sake to overlook the imperfection of their best services, they have the assurance founded on that promise that he who gives to a disciple even a cup of cold water in the name of a disciple, shall in no wise lose his reward. The Scriptures also teach that the happiness or blessedness of believers

in a future life will be greater or less in proportion to their devotion to the service of Christ in this life. Those who love little, do little; and those who do little, enjoy less. What a man sows that shall he also reap." Charles Hodge, Heavenly Rewards

"We must maintain therefore, justification complete and irrevocable by grace through faith and apart from works, and at the same time, future reward according to works. In reference to these two doctrines it is important to observe the following:

- This future reward is not justification and contributes nothing to that which constitutes justification.
- This future reward is not salvation. Salvation is by grace and it is not as a reward for works that we are saved.

The reward has reference to the station a person is to occupy in glory and does not have reference to the gift of glory itself." John Murray, Collected Writings, Volume II, p. 221


- Pleasing the Father and building on the foundation of Christ with gold, silver and costly stones (a life of faithful obedience) that results in Heavenly rewards, is a powerful incentive, especially in difficult times.
- We have been bought with a price, therefore we are to honor the Lord with our body. (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
- Even a cup of cold water given to a (culturally determined) marginal individual is noticed by the Father.
- A life of faithful living and servanthood is a testimony to grace to the watching world (1 Peter 2:12).

"It would be morally and spiritually beneficial for us to have a greater consciousness of this clear New Testament reaching on degrees of heavenly reward. Rather than making us competitive with one another, it would cause us to help and encourage one another that we all may increase our heavenly reward, for God has an infinite capacity to bring blessing to us all, and we are all members of one another (1 Corinthians 12:26-27). We would more eagerly heed the admonition of the author of Hebrews, 'Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near' (Hebrew 10:24-25). Moreover in our own lives a heartfelt seeking of future heavenly reward would motivate us to work wholeheartedly for the Lord at whatever task he calls us to, whether great of small, paid or unpaid. It would also make us long for his approval rather than for wealth or success. It would motivate us to work at building up the church on the one foundation, Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 3:10-15)."
